

Health Initiatives and Collaborations Aligned to the HEART Framework: The Flagship Program of the University of the Visayas

As a flagship institutional program, the **HEART Framework** embodies the University of the Visayas' commitment to a dynamic and socially responsive higher education—one that fully realizes the **trifocal functions of instruction**, **research**, **and extension**. Guided by its mission of fostering human development and social responsibility, the University positions the HEART Framework as a strategic platform that channels its academic expertise toward addressing the needs of **deprived**, **depressed**, **and underserved communities**.

The HEART Framework organizes UV's university initiatives into five flagship projects—**Health and Wellness, Ecology and Spirituality, Arts, Culture and Literacy, Resiliency Law and Order, and Technology and Livelihood**. Each cluster symbolizes a strategic thrust for community upliftment and a direct expression of the trifocal function in action.

Under the **Health and Wellness component of the HEART** Framework of the University of the Visayas (UV), the institution advances **SDG 3: Good Health and Well-Being through sustained, multi-sectoral collaboration** that expands access to essential health services for underserved and geographically isolated populations. The primary purpose of its health initiatives is to enhance equitable access to healthcare through partnerships with local, national, and international stakeholders, while simultaneously promoting preventive and community-based care

In 2024, UV operationalized **nine (9) active Memoranda of Agreement (MOAs) for Related Learning Experience (RLE)** with hospitals, local government units, private health providers, and international partners to institutionalize community-based healthcare delivery while strengthening experiential learning for students.

Through its international partnership with the Korea-Philippines Educational and Cultural Exchange Center, UV conducted a **medical and dental mission in the mountainous barangays of Tuburan, Cebu**, serving **100 beneficiaries** with free consultations, medicines, blood pressure monitoring, and dental extractions. This initiative directly addressed health access gaps in geographically isolated areas through international, local government, and university collaboration.

UV also partnered with the LGU Compostela during its **105th Foundation Anniversary Medical Mission**, mobilizing doctors, staff, and students to provide free medicines, health consultations, and gift distribution to **87 beneficiaries**, with pharmaceutical partners ensuring adequate medical supplies. This demonstrates effective public-private-academic partnership in expanding primary healthcare services.

Further, during the flagship outreach program Halad Pasalamat, UV collaborated with multiple local and private organizations to deliver **comprehensive medical, mental health, diagnostic, and preventive health care services**, including bone screening, blood sugar testing, cholesterol and uric acid testing, eye care, deworming, vaccination, and veterinary services. This large-scale initiative served **667 beneficiaries** within and outside the university community.

Complementing these community-based services, UV maintains a formal medical services MOA with Sagrada Corazon Health Services Inc. to ensure **continuous access to healthcare for students**, reinforcing early intervention and preventive health measures among 1,621 university students served in 2024.

Collectively, these collaborative health initiatives served **854 direct beneficiaries within one year**, clearly demonstrating University of the Visayas' concrete contribution to **SDG 3**, specifically under **Indicator 3.3.1 on partnerships for health service delivery**. Beyond service provision, UV further strengthens its impact through **three (3) published research studies directly aligned with SDG 3**, providing empirical support for community health improvement, preventive care, and health systems strengthening. This integration of **collaboration, service delivery, experiential learning, and research** positions UV as an active academic partner in advancing public health outcomes.

UNIVERSITY OF THE VISAYAS (UV), a duly organized educational institution existing under the laws of the Republic of the Philippines, with its principal address at Corner D. Jakosalem and Colon Streets., Cebu City, represented in this act by its Dean of College of Allied Health Sciences, DR. YVONNE SEVILLA, pursuant to a Board Resolution issued on June 26, 2023, hereinafter referred to as the SECOND PARTY.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the **FIRST PARTY** maintains and operates the Cebu City Medical Center for the primary purpose of providing adequate medical care to the unprivileged sector of Cebu City's population and a training facility for the students of all Commission on Higher Education accredited Medical and Para-Medical Schools in Cebu City and to undertake its own training program.

WHEREAS, the **SECOND PARTY** is an academic institution in Cebu City that offers Bachelor's Degree in Nursing and provides quality education and training to prepare its students to become qualified nurses.

WHEREAS, the FIRST PARTY through the Cebu City Medical Center shall provide the SECOND PARTY hereof the basic clinical service for the student's education, based upon the requirements of the Commission on Higher Education (CHED), Department of Health, and the Professional Regulation Commission.

WHEREAS, the **SECOND PARTY**, as part of its curriculum prescribed by the Commission on Higher Education (CHED); is in need of a medical institution where its nursing students can undertake internship affiliation known under CHED regulations as Related Learning Experience.



WHEREOF, the FIRST PARTY, and the SECOND PARTY hereby mutually agree to wit:

- The FIRST PARTY agrees and allows the affiliation and the training of Nursing Students of the SECOND PARTY subject to the Policies, Guidelines Governing Affiliation and Training of Students in the Department of Health hospitals and other government health facilities (DOH Administrative Order No. 5-A, Series of 1996 dated 17 February 1996).
- 2. This Memorandum of Agreement does not create a partnership, joint venture, or any other similar relationship between the parties.
- The FIRST PARTY shall provide the Nursing Students of the SECOND PARTY the maximum opportunity to gain access to the facilities of the hospital as may be available.
- 4. The FIRST PARTY shall provide the Nursing Students of the SECOND PARTY the necessary clinical experience as required by the course prior to the government board examination.
- 5. All breakages and damages any student may cause on the properties/equipment of the FIRST PARTY shall be the responsibility of the SECOND PARTY to replace broken or damaged equipment/property. The item shall be properly inspected and accepted by the CCMC Property Section.
- 6. The schedule of the SECOND PARTY must be presented to the FIRST PARTY prior to the start of the rotation and must be arranged with the CCMC Nursing Service Affiliate Coordinator with the Approval of the Head, Training Division in such a way that there is no overcrowding and conflict of schedule in one clinical area.
- 7. The **SECOND PARTY** shall avail the vacant areas and shift of the CCMC College of Allied Health Sciences-Nursing Department.
- 8. The **SECOND PARTY** shall provide a Clinical Instructor for the Nursing Students while undergoing Related Learning Experience (RLE) in Cebu City Medical Center with the ratio pursuant to CHED Regulation.

- Official notification from the SECOND PARTY be sent to the Head, Training Division for Nursing Affiliates a week before the withdrawal of students from the clinical area for school activities or special holidays.
- 10. The Clinical Instructors and students shall be subject to the rules and regulations of the Hospital and any disciplinary problems arising there from shall be referred to the Head, Training Division for Nursing Affiliates and to the Dean of the College of Allied Health Sciences-Nursing Department.

- 11. After the Related Learning Experience (RLE) in each clinical area, the students should secure a clearance signed by the Head, Training Division for Nursing Affiliates upon the recommendations from the Nurse In-charge of the Unit and Affiliate Coordinator.
- 12. That the **SECOND PARTY** should follow the training guidelines for schools and colleges of nursing affiliating with Cebu City Medical Center.
- 13. The FIRST PARTY and SECOND PARTY shall faithfully abide by and comply with the provisions of the Data Privacy Act of 2012, ensuring the confidentiality and proper handling of personal data.
- 14. The ownership of intellectual property rights that may arise as a consequence of the execution of this MOA shall be governed by the applicable and relevant intellectual property laws.
- 15. Damages, losses, and/or injuries caused by either party shall be governed by applicable laws, including the Civil Code, Labor Code, and other relevant regulations. The responsible party shall be liable for compensation or repairs, and any disputes shall be resolved through amicable discussions or legal proceedings.
- 16. The grounds for termination or pre-termination of this MOA shall include the following:
 - a. Failure to comply with the terms and conditions of this MOA;
 - b. Violation of the rules and regulations of the Cebu City Medical Center;
 - c. Non-adherence to the Data Privacy Act of 2012;
 - d. Any other ground that substantially hinders the implementation of the internship or clinical training program.
- 17. That this Memorandum of Agreement shall take effect upon the signing of the contract and shall remain in force for a period of three (3) years, renewable thereafter upon mutual agreement of the parties. Either party intending to pre-terminate this Agreement shall provide the other party with written notice at least one (1) month prior to the intended termination date.
- 18. This MOA may only be amended upon mutual written consent of both parties. Any changes must be agreed upon by both parties and incorporated as an addendum or revision to the MOA.
- 19. All relevant laws, rules, and regulations, including those from the DOH, CHED, PRC, and local ordinances, are incorporated into this MOA. Both parties agree to comply with these laws during the execution of the RLE program.



Magallanes St. and M.C. Briones St., Cebu City, Cebu pursuant to Sangguniang Panglungsod Resolution No. ______Series of 2024, Hereinafter referred to as FIRST PARTY;

UNIVERSITY OF THE VISAYAS, a non-stock corporation, and a duly organized educational institution existing under the laws of the Republic of the Philippines, with the principal address Corner D. Jakosalem St., Cebu City represented in this Act by its President, **DR. CONRADO E. IÑIGO, JR.** (see attached Secretary's Certificate dated January 15, 2024) hereinafter referred to as the **SECOND PARTY**.

WITNESSETH THAT:

WHEREAS, the FIRST PARTY maintains and operates a non-profit general hospital known as the Barangay Health Centers under the jurisdiction of the Cebu City Health Department for the primary purpose of providing adequate medical care to the underprivileged sector of the Cebu City's population and a training facility for the students of all Commission on Higher Education accredited Medical and Paramedical schools on Cebu City and to undertake its own training program;

WHEREAS, the **SECOND PARTY**, is an academic institution in Cebu City which offers a degree of Bachelor of Science in Nursing and provides quality education and training to prepare its students to become a qualified nurse;

WHEREAS, the FIRST PARTY, as part of its curriculum prescribed by the Commission on Higher Education (CHED), is need of hospitals and health facilities provide the appropriate clinical training and exposure to students of the programs under the CHED Technical Panel for Health Professions Education based on the Policies and Guidelines on the Affiliation of Higher Education Institutions with Hospitals and Other Health Facilities for the Training of Students in Health Professional Education;

WHEREAS, the FIRST PARTY has complied with the minimum requirements and qualifications for accreditation of hospitals and other health facilities as base or affiliating hospital/facility such us, but not limited to, training facilities, training coordinator, hospital equipment, bed capacity and patient load agrees to enter into a Contract of Affiliation with the SECOND PARTY;

WHEREAS, the FIRST PARTY agrees and allows the affiliation and training of Nursing students of the SECOND PARTY subject to the Policies, Procedures, and Guidelines governing affiliation and training of the students under the provisions of the Department of Health Commission on Higher Education Joint Administrative Order, DOH AO No. 2013-0034, CHED Memorandum Order No. 35 series of 2013, dated 07 November 2013.

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the foregoing premises, the parties herein bind themselves to the following covenants:

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- The FIRST PARTY agrees and allows the affiliation and training of Nursing students of the SECOND PARTY subject to the <u>Policies and Guidelines on the</u> <u>Affiliation of Higher Education Institutions with Hospitals and Other</u> <u>Health Facilities for the Training of Students in Health Professional</u> <u>Education</u>;
- The FIRST PARTY shall provide the Nursing Students of the SECOND PARTY the maximum opportunity to gain access to the facilities of the hospital as may be feasible;
- 3. The **FIRST PARTY** must comply with the minimum requirements set by CHED in order to sustain their accreditation throughout the duration of his agreement.
- The FIRST PARTY shall provide the Nursing Students of the SECOND PARTY the necessary clinical experiences as required by the course prior to the government board of examination;
- 5. All breakages and damages on the properties/equipment of the FIRST PARTY as may be caused by the students shall be replaced by the latter within reasonable time. Such item/s shall be properly inspected and accepted upon approval by the Property Section of the FIRST PARTY.
- 6. FIRST PARTY and the SECOND PARTY shall keep each other free and harmless and indemnify the other from third party claims, suits or demands which are due to negligent or fraudulent acts or omissions or wilful misconduct solely attributable to one but not the other.
- 7. The rotation schedule of the SECOND PARTY must be presented to the FIRST PARTY prior to the start of the rotation and must be arranged with the Nursing Service Affiliate Coordinator of the FIRST PARTY with the Approval of the Head of the Training Division of the FIRST PARTY in such way that there is no overcrowding and conflict of schedule in one clinical area;
- 8. The SECOND PARTY shall provide a Clinical Instructor for the Nursing Students, who have duly complied with the requirements of the Board OF Nursing and CHED to provide instruction to students in the said department, while undergoing Related Learning Experience (RLE) in Barangay Health Centers under the jurisdiction of the Cebu City Health Department.
- That the official notification from the SECOND PARTY shall be sent to the Head
 of the Training Division for Nursing Affiliates of the FIRST PARTY a week before
 the withdrawal of students from the clinical area for school activities and/or special
 holidays;
- 10. The Clinical Instructors and students shall be subject to the rules and regulations of the FIRST PARTY and any disciplinary problems arising therefrom shall be referred to the Head of the Training Division for Nursing Affiliates of the FIRST PARTY and to the Dean of the College of Nursing.
- 11. After the Related Learning Experience (RLE) in each clinical area, the students shall secure a clearance signed by the Head of the Training Division for Nursing Affiliates of the **FIRST PARTY** upon the recommendations from the Nurse Incharge of the unit and Affiliate Coordinator.
- 12. The **SECOND PARTY** should follow the Training guidelines for schools and colleges of nursing affiliating with the **FIRST PARTY**

- 13. The parties mutually agree that it will hold and secure any Confidential Information in strict confidence. Under the terms of confidentiality, the Parties agree that any such information will be treated with utmost confidentiality and that the parties and their respective employees/representatives will use reasonable efforts to protect such information shall not disclosed without the written consent of the other party, and that each Party will exercise the same nature that it does not desire to publish, disclose, or disseminate. This obligation shall continue in full force and effect subsequent to and notwithstanding the expiration of this Agreement.
- 14. In accordance with R.A. No. 10173, otherwise known as the 'Data Privacy Act of 2012," and its Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) and other applicable issuances by the National Privacy Commission (NPC), each party shall, in connection with this Agreement, Comply in all respects with the laws and regulations relating to data privacy protection and shall ensure that appropriate organizational, physical, and technical measures are in place to maintain the confidentiality, integrity and security of all personal data that may come to its knowledge or possession by reason of any provision of this Agreement and that its employees, agents, representatives, or any person acting under its authority shall hold personal information under strict confidentiality at al times. The Parties are under strict obligations to notify any potential or actual losses of any shared personal data or any data security breach to the other Party within one(1) Business Day of identification of any potential or actual loss to enable the Parties to consider what action is required in order to resolve the issue in accordance with the applicable data protection laws. The Parties agree to provide reasonable assistance as is necessary to each other to facilitate the handling of any data security breach in an expeditious and compliant manner.
- 15. This Memorandum of Agreement shall be effective three (3) years from the execution of the present instrument and renewable every three years thereafter upon mutual agreement of the parties herein. However, any party who opt to not to renew this Agreement shall serve a written notice to the other party at least thirty (30) days prior to the expiration of this Agreement.
- 16. The Parties may modify, amend, or revise any provision of this Agreement: Provided, that the requesting Party tenders at least thirty (30) days prior written notice of the proposed modifications/amendments/revision. The other Party may agree to the proposal or provide their own modifications/amendment/revision to the proposal. The recommendations shall be deemed approved and effective upon written agreement signed by herein parties: the FIRST PARTY and SECOND-PARTY;
- 17. The Parties hereto undertake not to assign, transfer, nor convey their respective rights, titles, or interest in this Agreement, nor any benefits arising therefrom,
- 18. In the event, that any one or more of the provisions contained in this Agreement is declared by a competent court to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable, in any respect, validity, legality, and enforceability of the remaining provisions herein shall not in any way be affected or impaired thereby.

EVERSLEY CHILDS SANITARIUM AND GENERAL HOSPITAL (ECSGH), a level | hospital of the Department of Health represented in this agreement by its Medical Center Chief I, DR. PYTHAGORAS M. ZERNA. WITH ADDRESS AT North Road, Jagobiao, Mandaue City, Philippines, hereinafter called the FIRST PARTY.

And

<u>UNIVERSITY OF THE VISAYAS, COLLEGE OF ALLIED HEALTH SCIENCES-DEPARTMENT OF NURSING</u>, with business and postal address at <u>D. Jakosalem, Colon St., Cebu City</u> a duly recognized institution by the Commission on Higher Education represented by its University President, <u>DR. CONRADO E. IÑIGO, JR.,</u> hereinafter called the **SECOND PARTY**.

WHEREAS ECSGH is a duly recognized Teaching and Training hospital with an accredited level II Family and Community Medicine (FAMED) residency-training program;

WHEREAS, ECSGH with its legal mandate to become level III teaching training allows Schools and Universities for its internship program of Nursing and Midwifery;

WHEREAS, the Second Party necessitates its student's internship program known under the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) regulation as RELATED LEARNING EXPERIENCE (RLE), as part of its curriculum, prescribed by the Commission to complement the student's classroom lessons;

WHEREAS, the Second Party Affiliates with the First Party for the Related Learning Experience by the students which is an absolute requirement by the Commission on Higher Education.

WHEREAS, the First Party and the Second Party agrees to this affiliation and executed this Contract of Affiliation, and for the First Party to provide Related Learning Experience to the students in all its clinical service areas, provided further that the Second Party agrees all the stipulation provided herein by the first party;

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the foregoing premises, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

SECTION I

EVERSLEY CHILDS SANITARIUM AND GENERAL HOSPITAL

a) The First Party allows and agrees affiliation of Students by the Second Party, consistent with its policies, procedures, rules, and regulations and the established procedures and guidelines governing affiliation and training of students stipulated under Administrative Order No. 5-A series of 1996 by the Department of

- b) That the First Party shall provide the students of the Second Party maximum of opportunity to gain access to the facilities, programs, and services as may be necessary.
- c) That the First Party shall provide the students of the Second Party the Related Learning Experience in the clinical wards allowing maximum observation and limitations in the execution of skills provided such action is allowed, with the presence of the Clinical Instructor (Faculty).
- d) The First Party shall collect an affiliation and RLE fee for each student for every clinical rotation submitted by the First Party as stipulated in this contract.

SECTION II

UNIVERSITY OF THE VISAYAS, COLLEGE OF ALLIED HEALTH SCIENCES-DEPARTMENT OF NURSING

- The Second Party binds herself/himself to abide with all rules and regulations, which the hospital imposes.
- b) The Second Party agrees that any serious violation of the rules and regulations appurtenant this training program shall constitute a ground for review of this contract and possible severance or termination of this agreement.
- c) That the Second Party shall provide a Clinical Instructor (C.I.) for the nursing students, during their clinical rotation, provided further that the Instructor has undergone the minimum mandatory training set by the First Party.
- The Second Party shall ensure the mandatory ratio of C.I. and students per clinical rotation pursuant of CHED regulation. (Levels II-IV: 1 C.I. for every 10 Students)
- e) The Second Party shall attend the General Orientation of Students called by the First Party once per year (for new students).
- f) The Second Party shall pay the Affiliation and RLE fees during their exposure with the First Party for each student per day.

Affiliation Fee 30.00 User's Fee 15.00

- g) The Second Party, should the students withdraw from their plotted schedules due to school activities and special holidays, shall notify the First Party through the Head of Training for nursing affiliates.
- h) That the Second Party is responsible for the hospitals' lost or damage equipment incurred by the affiliating students.

SECTION III

Confidentiality and Data Privacy

a) It is expressly understood by the Second Party that all personal data collected, form accomplished, and all other related documents, charts, manuals operational or technical processes that the First Party shall make available, shall be used for the sole purposes of performing the tasks under this training program. These are classified documents and considered confidential in nature and proprietary to the First Party.





The affiliates on training hereby undertake to prevent transfer of such information consciously or unconsciously to any party or agency outside without the knowledge and written consent by the First Party.

- b) The Second Party shall comply with the Data Privacy Act Legislation with regard to any and all Personal Data that it receives from the First Party.
- c) Both parties shall establish adequate safeguards for data privacy and security, adhere to the principle of transparency, legitimate purpose and proportionality when processing personal information, and uphold the right of the Data Subjects in compliance with the DPA Legislation.
- d) The First Party warrants that it has obtained the necessary consent of the Data Subject, to allow its representative to disclose the data subject's personal data to the Second Party, including service providers for any legitimate business purpose, to obtain, examine, process and store the Data Subject's, Personal Data.
- e) The Second Party shall notify the First Party if any complaints are received about the processing of the personal data received. The Second Party shall not make any admission or take any action which may be prejudicial to the defense or settlement of any such complaint and shall provide the First Party reasonable assistance as it may require in connection with such complaint.

SECTION IV

Termination

- a) In case one or more of the provision contained herein shall, for any reason, be held to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any of the provisions of this agreement. In such event, the parties shall consult each other as to the manner by which their original intention can be fulfilled as closely as possible and they will amend this Agreement accordingly.
- b) That the Hospital reserves the right to terminate this Contract of Affiliation, upon notice in the event that any of the above conditions are hereby violated.
- c) This contract is renewable every year for the next two years and may be renewed every two years thereafter.

This Memorandum of Agreement is entered into by and between:

The GASA SA GUGMA HOME FOR THE DYING DESTITUTE., a non-stock, non-profit corporation duly organized institution that provides care for elderly clients, and existing by virtue of Philippine laws, represented herein by Sr. M. JENCY JOSEPH M.C., of legal age, single, Filipino and residing in Cabantan Street, Barrio Luz, Mabolo, Cebu City. It's hereinafter referred as the FIRST PARTY.

UNIVERSITY OF THE VISAYAS COLLEGE OF ALLIED HEALTH SCIENCES-DEPARTMENT OF NURSING, an educational institution duly organized and existing under the laws of the Republic of the Philippines, with principal office at D. Jakosalem, Colon St., Cebu City, duly represented herein by its President, DR. CONRADO E. IÑIGO, JR., herein referred to as the "SECOND PARTY".

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, The Second Party, as a premiere academic institution, offers Nursing and other allied medical courses;

WHEREAS, The Second Party, as part of the curriculum prescribed by the Commission on Higher Education (CHED), is in need of a medical institution where its Nursing and other medical-related courses students can undertake internships affiliations known under CHED regulations as Related Learning Experience or Practicum;

WHEREAS, The First Party, a privately owned institution committed to the pursuit of providing competent, reliable, and professional medical and health care, has agreed to accommodate the aforementioned students/trainees of the Second Party as interns/trainees provided the quality of services and care if its clients is not affected thereby;

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the payment of Affiliation fees, the representation and warranties of the parties, and their faithful compliance with all covenants, terms and conditions hereinafter contained, the Second Party hereby agrees to under the following terms and conditions;

- The Second Party shall provide supervised clinical services to its Nursing, and other medical-related courses students/trainees through Related Learning Practicum using the facilities of the First Party as its laboratory;
- 2. The Second Party shall pay affiliation fees of P100.00 per student per day.
- 3. The Second Party shall provide clinical instructors who shall supervise and accompany its student/trainees while the latter is within the premises of the First Party at all times. The Second Party shall be fully responsible for the appointment, supervision, discipline, and compensation of the clinical instructors and shall ensure that they comply with the requirements and qualifications as prescribed by pertinent laws and regulations, such as but not limited to the Republic Act. No. 9173 (otherwise known as the New Nursing Law), and CHED issuances. There is no employer-employee relationship between the First Party and the Clinical Instructors, and the Second Party shall indemnify and hold the First Party client, its officers, and directors, free and harmless from any liability or damage involving the Clinical Instructors. The First Party, however, reserves the right to decline the admission or deny entry or participation at any time after admission of any clinical instructors, as it may deem fit and necessary, if and when the safety and welfare of its patients and staff is affected;


- 4. For purposes of the internship/practicum program contemplated in this Agreement, the Sister (Nurse) in charge of the ward together with the staff of the First Party shall coordinate with the clinical instructors in whatever manner or extent consistent with the staff duties and responsibilities to the First Party. They shall help ensure that no student/trainee of the Second Party shall attend to any client or use any facility, equipment, or supply of the First Party, unless with written authority of the First Party;
- Pursuant to Commission on Higher Education (CHED) regulations, the following ratio between Clinical Instructors and students/trainees who shall be at the premises of the First Party shall be maintained at all times;

Instructor: Student

(a) Level III	1:10	to	1:20
(b) Level IV	1:10	to	1:20

- 6. Prior to assigning its trainees to the First Party, the Second Party shall ensure that all of these students/trainees have complied with related theoretical instruction, as prescribed by the CHED/TESDA. Further, the First Party, or any other medical officer, as must be designated by the Second Party. As such, the First Party reserves the right to decline the admission, or deny entry or participation at any time, after admission, any trainee who does not deny entry or participation at any time, after admission any trainee who does not qualify with the required physical, mental and academic pre-requisites, such as but not limited to prescribed examination for trainees to be assigned to all areas, or if and when the safety and welfare of its patients and staff is affected;
- 7. The Second Party shall ensure that its students/trainees and clinical instructors shall comply with the First Party's rules, regulations and policies at all times. In case of damage(s) incurred by the First Party arising out of any nature imputable to the students/trainees or clinical instructors of the Second Party, the latter shall indemnify the First Party corresponding to the total amount of damages incurred by the First Party;
- 8. For academic purposes, the students/trainees of the Second Party maybe required by the First Party to make survey and case presentations of certain selected area/case to be designated by the First Part;
- The number of hours for each student/trainee to undertake internship/practicum affiliation shall be EIGHT hours per trainee per day. In cases where longer hours are required, the Second Party, through it authorized representatives, shall secure the prior written approval of the First Party;
- 10. The First Party shall in no manner be answerable or accountable for any claim, action costs, suits, incident, loss liability, damage or injury of any kind, character, type of description, including attorney's fees and legal expenses, which may occur, be brought sustained or received by the students/trainees or clinical instructors as a consequence of arising from or in connection with this Agreement. The Second Party hereby agrees to assume all liabilities, claims, and actions for any and all such injury, loss cost, or damage, leaving the First Party, its officers, directors, and employees, free and harmless therefrom;
- 11. The Second Party shall maintain the confidentiality or information involving the clients at all times. The student/trainee and clinical instructors of the Second Party shall not disclose any such information, or reproduce records, without written approval of the First Party;



- 12. At the end of every internship/practicum affiliation, the sister-in-charge in the ward shall affix its signature to prescribed reports to be prepared by the Second Party. Such signature shall not in any way impute liability or give rise to any obligation or responsibility or give rise to signify as a witness to the specific act or undergoing internship/practicum affiliation at the First Party;
- 13. The failure of the First Party to insist upon the strict performance of any of the terms, covenants, and conditions hereof shall not be deemed a relinquishment of waiver of any subsequent breach or default of the terms and conditions hereof, which terms covenants, and conditions shall continue to be in full force effect. No waiver by the First Party of any rights this agreement shall be deemed to have been made unless expressed in writing, signed by the First Party, and duly notarized;
- 14. This agreement constitutes and embodies the entire and complete agreement between the parties and no other terms and conditions, verbal or otherwise, not herein expressly contained, other than those embodied in the policies and guidelines which the First Party may institute, and to modify, be added to in any manner alter the provisions herein agreed upon unless such change, modification, addition, or alteration is expressly stipulated in writing and duly executed, signed by both parties notarized;
- 15. If any term or provision of this Agreement shall be held to be illegal or unenforceable, in whole or in part, under any enactment or rule of law, such term or provision shall extend, be deemed not to form part of this Agreement shall not be affected;
- 16. The term of this Agreement shall be (3) years commencing from August 5, 2024, and expiring on August 5, 2027, and may be renewed under such terms and conditions as may be mutually agreed upon by the parties herein.


WHEREAS, the SECOND PARTY, desires to give broader clinical training to its Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) interns by sending them to the FIRST PARTY for practical learning and training under the FIRST PARTY's nursing units/department, and the FIRST PARTY has accepted the same;

A. RESPONSIBILITIES OF FIRST PARTY:

- 1. Conduct one (1) day orientation to the interns on hospital policies, and house rules, as well as Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) before the start of the actual internship;
- 2. Allow the interns for an eight-hour Clinical Internship per day, from Monday to Sunday;
- 3. The staff nurses of the FIRST PARTY shall coordinate with the clinical instructors in whatever manner or extent consistent with the staff nurses' duties and responsibilities of the FIRST PARTY. They shall help ensure that no student/ trainee of the SECOND PARTY shall attend to any patient or use any facility, equipment or supply of the FIRST PARTY without the supervision of the Clinical Instructors of the SECOND PARTY. Shall make available to the SECOND PARTY certain and applicable medical facilities and allow them access to the same, depending on the mutual agreement of, and specification by, both parties, which may be necessary in the implementation of the internship program;
- 4. Issue a Certificate of Completion to the interns upon the completion of internship program.


B. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE SECOND PARTY

 Submit to the SECOND PARTY pertinent documents, sets of forms to be used during the internship including but not limited to the bio-data and other credentials of all interns prior to the actual commencement of the Internship for purposes of FIRST PARTY profiling;





- Supervising clinical instructors are required a minimum of 80 hours preceptorship training in clinical areas: Outpatient Department, Private Rooms, Ward and 160 hours for special areas: Hemodialysis, Labor and Delivery Room Complex, NICU/ICU, Operating Room, Emergency, before supervising actual interns.
- 3. Submit the duty rotation for the whole semester not less than 2 weeks before the start of the rotation, and is subject for approval by the FIRST PARTY;
- 4. Provide clinical instructors who shall supervised and accompany its students/ trainees while the latter are within the premises of the FIRST PARTY at all times. The SECOND PARTY shall be fully responsible for the appointment, supervision, discipline and compensation of these clinical instructors and shall ensure that they comply with the requirements and qualifications as prescribed by pertinent laws and regulations, such as but not limited to Republic Act. No. 9173 (otherwise known as the New Nursing Law), and CHED issuances.
- 5. Coordinate with the FIRST PARTY or its authorized representative regarding the program or training, assignments and discipline of interns, holidays, convocations and other allied matters;
- 6. Prior to assigning its trainees to the FIRST PARTY, the SECOND PARTY shall ensure that all of these student/ trainees have complied with related theoretical instruction, as prescribed by the CHED. Further, the SECOND PARTY shall ensure that all of these students/ trainees are physically and mentally fit to undergo internship practicum affiliation, as certified by the Health Officer of the Second Party, or any other medical officer, as may be designated by the FIRST PARTY. As such the FIRST PARTY reserves the right to decline the admission of or deny entry or participation at any time, after admission, any trainee who does not qualify with the required physical, mental and academic prerequisites, such as but not limited to prescribed examination for trainees to be assigned to the Operating Room, Neonatal Intensive Care Unit, Delivery Room and Medical Surgical areas, or if and when the safety and welfare of its patients and staff is affected;
- Require the interns to attend the one (1) day orientation and require them to abide by all the
 house rules and regulations, policies and SOPs of the FIRST PARTY relative to the Bachelor
 of Science in Nursing internship program;
- 8. Pay the FIRST PARTY the affiliation fee of PHP 80 per day as affiliation fee per intern every end of the semester which shall be issued with corresponding official receipts; and
- 9. Prior to the commencement of the internship program, all interns and clinical instructors must participate in the mandatory American Heart Association Basic Life Support (BLS) training conducted by the FIRST PARTY. A corresponding fee of PHP 500 per intern/instructor applies, which the SECOND PARTY is obligated to settle on or before the designated training date. However, exemption from this requirement may be granted if the FIRST PARTY furnishes valid certificates demonstrating that the student/instructor has already completed Basic Life Support training in accordance with American Heart Association standards.
- Shall assist in the familiarization procedures in connection with the standards set by the FIRST PARTY;
- 11. In accordance with regulations set forth by the Commission on Higher Education (CHED), it is mandated that the maximum ratio of 1:10 between Clinical Instructors and interns present on the premises of the FIRST PARTY must be upheld consistently."





- 12. Undertakes that the intern, in conduct of its internship program, shall handle the patients as well as the properties and equipment of the FIRST PARTY with utmost care and diligence;
- 13. Shall be responsible for interns' negligent or intentional acts or omissions that may result to injuries to patient/s or damage/s to the properties of the FIRST PARTY and undertakes to assume full responsibility for any and all acts of Interns;
- 14. Only endorse, provide or send to the FIRST PARTY, interns that are considered as fully-vaccinated of COVID-19 with at least one booster shoot, in accordance with the existing laws, rules and regulations on such matter.

C. OTHER TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

- 1. It is understood that for purpose of the internship program, the FIRST PARTY shall be considered as an extension of the premises of the SECOND PARTY. Utmost diligence required and imposed upon by the SECOND PARTY must likewise be observed by the interns while they are at the premises of the FIRST PARTY;
- 2. That, the FIRST PARTY shall not assign the interns/LE students of the SECOND PARTY in a COVID-19 ward/floor and the FIRST PARTY is not liable to the said students whatever sickness they may have, COVID-19 included, unless such infection is caused by the negligence, fault, or intentional act of the FIRST PARTY, its officers, employees, or agents.
- 3. There shall be no employer and employee relationship created herein. At no time will the interns be deemed as employees of the FIRST PARTY. Interns shall not be entitled to any form of compensation or remuneration, whatsoever, it being understood, that their presence at The Hospital at Maayo is solely for the purpose of learning and training under the internship program;
- 4. Parties hereto acknowledge that they may have access to confidential and proprietary information while carrying out their obligations. As a corollary, parties have the duty to protect the confidentiality of such information, in accordance to, including but not limited to:
- Individually identifiable health information, including, but not limited to, patient medical records, demographic information, medical, personal, or financial identifiers or paymentrelated information;
- Personal information about employees, physicians, nurses, and other caregivers and other individuals affiliated with the parties;
- C. Business record and proprietary information including but not limited to, records, audit and accounting records, risk management and compliance activities, quality assurance information,
 operations, policies and procedures, business development and strategic plans and similar information; and
- d. Other personal, sensitive or privileged information as provided by law.
- 5. That it is mutually agreed upon by the parties that all patient injury and property damage (e.g. breakages), and losses caused by the intern of on the patient or equipment, properties, and supplies of the FIRST PARTY, shall be charge to the student upon demand of the FIRST PARTY. In the event that the intern is unable to pay immediately, the SECOND PARTY may shoulder the payment in advance and charge it to the student;
- It is understood that the FIRST PARTY shall be held free and harmless from and against any and all costs, expenses, damages, lawsuits and or liabilities or claims



arising, whether directly or indirectly, from or related to any and all claims due to injury, loss or death from or related to COVID-19, while the interns are participating in any activity relating to the conduct of the internship program, unless the injury, loss or death is due to the fault or negligence of the FIRST PARTY, its officers, employees, or agents;

- 7. This agreement shall be valid for a period of one (1) year from the date of signing hereof which shall commence on the above-date and shall expire one (1) year thereafter. Parties may extend or renew this agreement subject to the terms and conditions as may be agreed thereupon;
- 8. This Agreement may be amended in writing as mutually agreed upon by the parties;
- 9. The parties agree that they will endeavor to amicably resolve any all disputes, controversies and conflicts that may arise out of or in connection with this agreement.

Safety Protocols to Control and Prevent the Spread of Covid-19

- 1. Purpose: prevent and control the spread of the dreaded Covid-19, and its variant, and to ensure the safety and health of everyone.
- 2. First Party, its College of Allied Health Sciences-Department of Nursing and Clinical Instructor shall instruct:
 - a. The serious nature of Covid-19

This Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) made and entered into this SEP 252025 , in the City of Cebu, Philippines, by and between:

The UNIVERSITY OF THE VISAYAS, an educational institution duly organized and existing under the laws of the Republic of the Philippines, with principal office at Corner D. Jakosalem Colon St., Cebu City, duly represented herein by its President, **DR. CONRADO E. IÑIGO JR.**, hereinafter referred to as **the FIRST PARTY**;

and

The PSYCARE INC., a SEC registered private corporation, established under the existing laws of the Republic of the Philippines with principal office at Cebu City, Cebu, represented herein by its President, **DR. WILLIAM L. BUOT**, hereinafter referred to as the **SECOND PARTY**.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the First Party, as a premier academic institution, offers a Bachelor of Science in Nursing program;

WHEREAS, the First Party, as part of the curriculum prescribed by the Commission on Higher Education (CHED), is in need of an institution where its nursing students can undertake internship affiliations known under CHED regulations as Related Learning Experience or Practicum;

WHEREAS, the Second Party, as an accredited psychiatric care private facility by the Department of Health (DOH) and by PhilHealth, and committed to the pursuit of providing competent, reliable, and professional medical and health care, has agreed to accommodate the aforementioned students of the First Party as interns/trainees thereby:

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the payment of Affiliation fees, the representation and warranties of the parties, and their faithful compliance with all covenants, terms and conditions hereinafter contained, the parties hereby agree to the following terms and conditions:

- The First Party shall provide supervised clinical services to its BS Nursing students through Related Learning Experience/Practicum using the facilities of the Second Party as its laboratory;
- The First Party shall pay affiliation fees recommended by DOH Regional Office VII to the Second Party; Affiliation fee: 2000 per student for the whole rotation.

- 3. The First Party shall provide clinical instructors who shall supervise and accompany its students while the latter are within the premises of the Second Party at all times. The First Party shall be fully responsible for the appointment, supervision, discipline and compensation of these clinical instructors and shall ensure that they comply with the requirements and qualifications as prescribed by the Republic Act. No. 9173 (otherwise known as the new Nursing Law), and CHED issuance;
- 4. For purposes of the internship/practicum program contemplated in this Agreement, the staff nurses of the Second Party shall coordinate with the clinical instructors of the First Party in whatever manner or extent consistent with the latter's duties and responsibilities. No student of the First Party shall attend to any patient or use any facility, equipment, or supply of the Second Party, unless with verbal or expressed authority of the latter;
- 5. Pursuant to Commission on Higher Education (CHED) regulations, the following ratio between Clinical Instructors and students who shall be at the premises of the Second Party shall be maintained at all times:
- 6. Prior to assigning its students to the Second Party, the First Party shall ensure that all affiliating students have complied with the related theoretical instruction, as prescribed by the Commission on Higher Education. As such, the Second Party reserves the right to decline the admission, or deny entry or participation at any time to any student who does not qualify with the required physical, mental and academic pre-requisites, or if and when the safety and welfare of its patients and staff is affected;
- 7. The Student and/or the Clinical Instructor shall be personally responsible for all claims or demands arising out of their own act, fault, or negligence, in the course of the training.
- 8. For academic purposes, the students of the First Party may be required by the Second Party to make a survey and conduct a case presentation on certain selected areas/cases to be determined by the Second Party. Surveys, case conferences/presentations. etc. will be the property of the Second Party and the First Party and the student expressly consents and allows the Second Party to use the above data and result of the survey in publications that will be in the public domain without having seek their written approvals/permissions and thereby release the Second Party from liabilities/claims/counterclaims of the plagiarism to the originators of the data/findings.
- The number of training hours for each student to undertake internship/practicum affiliation shall not exceed EIGHT (8) hours per student per day. In cases where longer hours are required, the First Party, through its authorized representatives, shall secure prior written approval of the Second Party;
- 10. In the event of illness/injury or damage of any kind, character, type or description which may be sustained by the students or clinical instructors as a consequence of or arising from or in connection with this Agreement without fault of the SECOND PARTY, no responsibility or liability will accrue to the latter;

- 11. The First Party shall maintain the confidentiality of information involving the clients at all times. The students and clinical instructors of the First Party shall not disclose any such information, or reproduce records, without the written approval of the Second Party.
- 12. At the end of every internship/practicum affiliation, the staff nurse/s of the Second Party shall affix his/her signature in the prescribed completion forms to be prepared by the First Party.
- 13. The failure of one Party to insist upon the strict performance of any of the terms, covenants, and conditions hereof shall not be taken as a relinquishment or waiver of any subsequent breach or default of the terms and conditions herein but rather, they shall be deemed to continue in full force and effect. No waiver by either Party of any rights under this agreement shall be deemed to have been made unless expressed in writing, signed by the waiving Party and duly notarized;
- 14. Whoever by act or omission causes damage to another, including but not limited to, the Student Intern, there being fault or negligence, shall be obliged to pay for the damage done.
- 15. The FIRST PARTY shall not be responsible for matters that are beyond its control, and cannot warrant all the safety or convenience of the circumstances under which the Student Intern and/or the Clinical Instructor will be in, during the training.
- 16. The PARTIES adhere to all laws and regulations that ensure protection to participants, especially the Student Intern, from all forms of risk to one's safety, privacy, security, and well-being, including but not limited to, the Anti-Sexual Harassment Act of 1995 (Republic Act No. 7877).
- 17. The PARTIES adopt the general data privacy and data sharing principles declared in the Data Privacy Act of 2012 and its Implementing Rules and Regulations, and adhere to the principles of transparency, legitimate purpose, and proportionality in the processing of personal data under this Agreement.
- 18. Nothing herein shall prevent one party from terminating this Agreement effective immediately upon written notice to the other party on the grounds of any material breach in the provisions of this Agreement
- 19. This Memorandum of Agreement constitutes and embodies the entire and complete agreement between the contracting parties and no other terms and conditions, verbal or otherwise, not herein expressly contained, shall modify or be added to, or in any manner alter the provisions herein agreed upon unless such change, modification, addition or alteration is expressly stipulated in writing and duly executed, signed by both parties and notarized;
- 21. If any term or provision of this Agreement shall be held to be illegal or unenforceable, in whole or in part, under any enactment or rule of law, such term or provision shall, to that extent only, be deemed not to form part of this Agreement leaving the other lawful provisions enforceable;

- 24. The term of this Agreement shall be for two (2) years, commencing from




