

Advancing Community Health Services: The Outreach and Wellness Programs of the University of the Visayas

University of the Visayas (UV) advances SDG 3.3.2 by committing institutional resources and student volunteerism to expand essential and preventive health services within the university and surrounding communities. The purpose of the **Outreach and Wellness Programs** is to promote health maintenance, reinforce community safety during large public gatherings, and ensure a critical blood supply, all through coordinated external partnerships and focused outreach. By leveraging its College of Allied Health Sciences and University Medical Clinic, the University of the Visayas actively provides immediate medical support, facilitates preventive screening, and offers valuable experiential learning opportunities that serve public health priorities.

The University of the Visayas (UV) advances **SDG 3.2.2** through a comprehensive, HEART-aligned approach that strengthens preventive healthcare access, enhances early detection systems, and builds long-term community health resilience. UV's outreach and wellness programs focus on delivering direct services, expanding partnerships, improving health workforce capacity, and embedding a culture of prevention across the institution and its partner communities.

UV provides direct health management, preventive measures, and essential medical supplies to both the university community and the general public. These services include free medical consultations, assessments, treatment, referrals, and health advice, complemented by preventive screenings such as bone and uric acid testing and influenza vaccination. In 2024, a total of **4,596 individuals** accessed these essential services. By strengthening early detection and preventive health-seeking behaviors, these initiatives contribute to reducing risks associated with preventable illnesses, particularly those affecting children and vulnerable populations.

Through medical volunteer engagements during high-volume events such as **Sinulog Festival 2024**, students gained hands-on experience in mass health logistics, emergency response, and community engagement. These efforts ensured access to medical assistance for **thousands of pilgrims and attendees**, contributing to improved emergency preparedness—an essential factor in reducing preventable injuries and health complications among families and children. This enhances the health sector's capacity to deliver timely, life-saving services by equipping students with real-world public health competencies

UV expands its reach and mobilizes critical health resources by coordinating with external partners. A key initiative is the university's collaboration with **BOMBO Radio** for a blood-letting campaign, which successfully secured **200 voluntary blood donors** to strengthen local blood bank reserves. A stable supply of safe blood is vital for emergency pediatric care, maternal health, and trauma management, directly contributing to the prevention of mortality in high-risk populations.

The **UV** reinforces evidence-based planning and health systems strengthening. Data gathered from the **4,596 beneficiaries** of UV's consultations and screenings provide an empirical foundation for designing targeted health programs, identifying community health risks, and guiding the allocation of institutional health resources. This supports more strategic preventive care interventions, which contribute to reducing avoidable health complications and improving long-term health outcomes.

Lastly, this outreach and wellness programs ensures the continuity of UV's health impact. The sustained commitment of the College of Allied Health Sciences (CAHS) and University Medical Clinic (UMC) to major public events, along with the routine availability of free health consultations and preventive screenings, has positioned the university as a reliable partner in community health promotion. These consistent efforts reinforce a strong preventive health culture, supporting early intervention practices that help reduce preventable mortality and morbidity.

Collectively, these initiatives demonstrate the University of the Visayas' vital role in advancing community well-being and long-term public health resilience through its sustained contributions to enhanced preventive healthcare access, improved emergency response capacity, strengthened health systems, and the continuous promotion of early health-seeking behaviors. By seamlessly integrating service delivery, strategic partnerships, student training, and research, UV ensures that its health interventions are inclusive, evidence-based, and sustainably scaled for lasting community impact










